<p><b>●Course Aims and Contents</b> Targets of this course are to have overall knowledge about kanji, and to be able to understand and use 2,000 kanji and kanji vocabulary. In this course, participants learn about 2,000 kanji and kanji words which are listed by frequency. Students are required to take a kanji test in every lesson (240-640 words with 80 kanji) in order to increase their kanji vocabulary. There is a reading test and a writing test in a kanji test. Kanji reading test is obligatory, kanji writing test is optional. After the kanji test, various topics about kanji (the rule of Japanese kanji pronunciation, the rule of kanji transitive/intransitive verbs and passive/causative forms etc.) are lectured.</p> <p><b>●Course Prerequisites</b> Participants should have already known about 800 kanji.</p> <p><b>●Course Evaluation Methods</b> Attendance: 30%, Participation: 20%, Kanji tests: 50%</p> <p><b>●Notice for Students</b> Students who withdraw from this course must fill out the designated form (Course Withdrawal Request) and submit the form to the instructor in charge by the end of May.</p>

### ●Aim of the Course
